We connect WA people and products to the rest of the country and the world. Safely connecting and contributing to Western Australian communities is what we do, and we're in it for the long haul.

Our Northam, Merredin and Narrogin teams are central to this commitment. They are responsible for the upgrade and maintenance of the busy Eastern Goldfields Railway (EGR) and a large section of the Grain Freight Rail Network including numerous level crossings, signals and communications equipment. In addition, our team of network controllers at the Avon Control Centre work 24/7 to ensure the safe and efficient operation of trains in the region.

Covering over 2,500 kilometres, the work of the Wheatbelt team allows containerised freight and

we understand the needs of industry are constantly changing, and we're quick to respond by improving the rail network to support new projects and economic growth. commodities to be transported from the Eastern States and plays a vital role in delivering WA grain to the world.

Our ongoing investment into the optimisation of the EGR and the grain network ensures we continue to provide the critical infrastructure required to connect WA with national and global markets. Since Arc Infrastructure was awarded the long-term lease of the railway in 2000, we've invested over \$470 million into our infrastructure throughout the Wheatbelt region.

Our commitment to the Wheatbelt extends far bevond investment into our infrastructure. We contribute to the economic growth and development of the region by employing local people, engaging with industry, buying from local business, working in partnership with our customers, supporting community initiatives and protecting the environment.

We make a real difference by partnering with community organisations to achieve meaningful outcomes. On average, Arc Infrastructure makes a direct contribution of more than half a million dollars to regional WA each year in the form of community partnerships, cash and in-kind donations and volunteering hours.

With many of our own employees living and working in regional Western Australia, we understand how important the provision of mental health services can be. especially for those who are most vulnerable. In 2017 our teams raised just under \$110,000 for Youth Focus.
