Hundreds turn out to celebrate WA's unique rail heritage

Hosted by the WA Railway Museum in Bassendean on Sunday 8 October, crowds flocked to experience live steam engine demonstrations, model railways and guided tours of the museum including reconditioned historic passenger carriages from the Golden Age of rail travel.

This year provided extra significance with the release of special display and a new book celebrating the 100 year anniversary of the rail network connecting to the rest of Australia.
